

THE TOWN OF ST. GEORGE SPECIAL MEETING OF COUNCIL

1) CALL MEETING TO ORDER:

<u>Deputy Mayor Faith Avery</u> called the meeting to order in the Council Chambers at Magaguadavic Place on Thursday, December 5th, 2019 at 6:05 pm. Present: <u>Councillor Harris</u>, <u>Councillor Cooke</u>, <u>Councillor Deveau</u>, <u>Councillor Allison</u>. And Councillor Murray. Also in attendance: Jason Gaudet, (CAO/Clerk) and eleven (11) people in gallery.

2) AGENDA:

It was moved by <u>Councillor Allison</u>, seconded by <u>Councillor Cooke</u> to approve the Agenda as presented.

3) PRESENTATION:

- a) Public Hearing on By-Law # 83 Tourism Accommodation Levy Jason Gaudet (Clerk) gave details on by-law, currently in its 3rd and final reading.
 - Susan Hill, Charlotte Coastal Region Tourism Association Mrs. Hill encouraged Council to use the revenue from the levy to support the initiatives of the CCRTA.
 - Bill Campbell, representing Jon & Ann Kim, owner of Granite Town Hotel Mrs.
 Campbell expressed a number of concerns from the owners such as concerns around confidentiality of data (ie. Room sales), matching contributions, exemption of small operations (ie. B&B, AirBnB), regional/LDS contributes
 - Phillip Maxwell Jr., Granite Town Camping Mr. Maxwell raises concerns regarding long term stays (seasonal campsites) at his campground.
- b) A motion to table the third and final reading of By-Law # 83 Tourism Accommodation Levy was made by <u>Councillor Harris</u>, seconded by <u>Councillor Cooke</u>, to address issues/concerns raised. Motion carried.
- c) Public Hearing on By-Law # 85 Garbage & Recyclables Collection. Residents Raymond Hall, Louis Rubin and Deenie Wilson asked questions and expressed concerns on several sections of the bylaw particularly regarding the matter of prohibited/permitted garbage bins and earliest time to place garbage at curbside.
- d) A motion to table the third and final reading of By-Law # 85 Garbage & Recyclables Collection was made by <u>Councillor Cooke</u>, seconded by <u>Councillor Allison</u>, to address issues/concerns raised. Motion carried.
- e) Public Hearing on By-Law # 23-D-1901, an amendment of By-Law # 23-D, A By-Law Respecting Traffic on Streets, regarding the establishment of a new road/street of "Pawprint Lane" Jason Gaudet (Clerk) gave details on the by-law, currently in its 3rd and final reading.
- f) Resolution of Council of a third and final reading of By-Law # 23-D-1901, an amendment of By-Law # 23-D, A By-Law Respecting Traffic on Streets, regarding the establishment of a new

- road/street of "Pawprint Lane" was moved by <u>Councillor Allison</u>, seconded by <u>Councillor Murray</u>. Motion carried.
- g) Hearing of Appeal(s) related to a Notice to Comply Order #2019-003 issued on November 20, 2019 for 25 South Street (PID#01314665) under By-Law 8-D Dangerous and Unsightly Premises (2019), Section 131(3) Jason Gaudet (Clerk) gave details on the order, Council was in possession of the building inspector report. Be it resolved, in accordance with By-Law#8-D (Dangerous and Unsightly Premises, based on the Inspection Report regarding PID#01314665, that the Town of St. George will move forward with demolition of the building. Moved by Councillor Murray, Seconded by Councillor Cooke. Motion carried.
