- a. A letter from Sean Morton regarding 4 wheelers and trails was summarized. The trail mentioned does not allow access to four wheelers at this time.
- **b.** A letter from David Armstrong regarding engineering for the Town was summarized. Mr. Armstrong would like to know how much the Town has spent on engineering and why the Town does not use local services. This request is with CAO Jason Gaudet who is working on collecting pertinent information for Mr. Armstrong.
- c. Council received an invitation to the Old Jail Day in St. Andrews on July 13.

#### 14) STATEMENTS BY MEMBERS OF COUNCIL:

- a. <u>Deputy Mayor Avery</u> stated she is happy to see the Troop sign is cleared of surrounding debris.
- **b.** <u>Councillor Harris</u> wanted to mention how good Canal looks. He was not able to make it to the cleanup day but he is aware that Irving sent employees and he thinks Canal looks fantastic.
  - c. <u>Deputy Mayor Avery</u> asked if the outdoor library can be moved to the old Irving parking lot with the community sign. <u>Mayor Cook</u> agreed that is a great location for it as soon as the grass comes in.
  - **d.** <u>Mayor Cook</u> mentioned the Tender coming out on NBON for the property behind the Habitat home for apartments.

## 15) PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS:

- a. David Armstrong asked what the Town Council could do about the excessive speeding in the Town. Council talked about getting the radar electronic speed sign from the Regional Service Commission again, which sends all data directly to the RCMP. Armstrong stated he would buy a sign and get the information to the Town but Council agreed that it should be a sign from the Commission that sends the data without human 'interference'. Mayor Cook stated the unfortunate truth that the RCMP do not do as much of the smaller rural policing but said 'if there was a murder, great.
- **b.** Sam Rubin asked if there is going to be a barrier placed at the Eagle's Nest and the answer was yes.

- c. Raymond Hall asked who looks after the trails from his house on Mount Pleasant to the Pipe Line. He would like to trim the trails; council agreed that would be great.
- **d.** Allen Grant asked if the Town Pump could be fixed. <u>Mayor Cook</u> stated this was fixed last year and vandals got to it again. She stressed that if people see vandalism to please report it.
